## "Police Identify Suspects in Violent Home Invasion: Hunt for Armed and Dangerous Individuals Intensifies"

The College Station Police Department has identified Nyah Jeanette Davis as a person wanted in connection with a violent home invasion that occurred in early January. Evidence linking Davis to the investigation was discovered during the execution of a search warrant at an apartment complex on First Street. Both Davis and another individual, Clayton James Rowley, are considered "armed and dangerous." Rowley is wanted for Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon and Unlawful Carrying of a Weapon by a Felon, while Davis faces an active felony arrest warrant for burglary of a habitation. Law enforcement surrounded a residence to serve a search warrant, but Rowley was not found inside. The SWAT Team, Hostage Negotiation Team, and Bomb Squad were deployed due to the violent nature of the offense, and two individuals were detained and later released. The investigation is ongoing, and individuals with information are urged to contact the College Station Police Department.

In response to the violent home invasion, the College Station Police Department conducted a search warrant at an apartment complex, leading to the identification of Nyah Jeanette Davis as a wanted individual. The search also implicated Clayton James Rowley in connection with the investigation. Both suspects are considered dangerous, and Rowley is wanted for specific charges related to the case. Despite the deployment of law enforcement teams, Rowley was not found at the targeted residence. The police emphasize the seriousness of the situation, urging anyone with information to contact them or their local law enforcement agency. Authorities caution against attempting to approach or make contact with the suspects due to their dangerous status.
